## Year in Reflection and a Look at 2017-18

What a year 2016-17 was! We spent the year dedicated to making Nampa High even better and accomplished many goals. We are now hard at work planning for an amazing 2017-18 school year.

We highly encourage any and all parents to get involved at Nampa High School and in the lives of their children through the Nampa Booster Club and, for senior parents, the Project Graduation Committee. These clubs and groups are vital and important to our school and our students. The Booster Club president this coming year will be Lisa Hendricks, and the Project Graduation Committee will meet and hold elections on Tuesday, August 29, at 7:00 p.m. in the cafeteria conference room right after our NHS Open House from 5:00-7:00 p.m. that same evening. You have probably seen that the City of Nampa has begun a pedestrian and road improvement project along Lake Lowell Avenue in front of Nampa High that will last most of the summer. The \$1.38 million construction project will improve pedestrian safety, add two flashing beacons, and rebuild the road and sidewalks on Lake Lowell Avenue in front of NHS. The project is expected to wrap up on August 18, right before the first day of school on August 23. During construction, Lake Lowell will be limited to one westbound travel lane. Entry points into the high school will be closed

along Lake Lowell Avenue, so **everyone will need to enter the school off of 12<sup>th</sup> Avenue or West Georgia Avenue throughout the summer for any and all events!**
